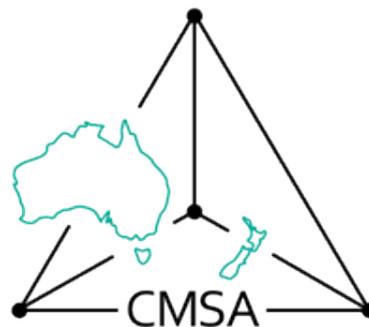

44ACC December 2022

The 44th Australasian Combinatorics Conference (44ACC) will be held entirely online via Zoom and hosted by the University of Otago, New Zealand, 12–16 December 2022.

The conference programme will mimic a traditional physical conference with presentation times planned for 1100–1400 and 1700–2000 NZDT. It will include invited talks, contributed talks, a presentation of the CMSA Anne Penfold Street Student Prize for the best student talk at the conference, and the CMSA Annual General Meeting.

Researchers in any area of discrete mathematics and its applications are warmly invited to attend and contribute a talk. Local groups may wish to organise attendance in a meeting room with projection facilities to promote discussion and create a conference atmosphere.

New Appointments

Congratulations to the following.

Professor Paul Bonnington, a former president of CMSA and long time Council member, formerly Director of eResearch at Monash University and before that at the University of Auckland, has been appointed as Pro-Vice Chancellor (Research Infrastructure) at The University of Queensland. Professor Catherine Greenhill, University of New South Wales, also a former president of CMSA and long time Council member, has been elected a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Science in recognition of her outstanding contributions to science. Catherine has apparently helped the Academy achieve an historical event: 2022 is the first year in which at least 50% of the annual election of new fellows are women. Curiously for a scientific organisation, the Academy's [announcement](#) doesn't exactly state the event in this way, but most would infer it.

Vale Lynn Batten 1948–2022

Sadly we report the passing of Lynn Batten on 28 July 2022 in Melbourne. She earned her PhD at the University of Waterloo in 1977. After some time at the University of Manitoba, she was appointed Professor of Mathematics at Deakin University in 2000. She made significant contributions to IT security and finite geometry, and was closely involved with the cyber security industry. Her books include 'Combinatorics of Finite Geometries', 'The Theory of Finite Linear Spaces: Combinatorics of Points and Lines' (with Albrecht Beutelspacher), 'Public Key Cryptography: Applications and Attacks'. Lynn was a CMSA Council member in 2000/3/4/5 and organised the 2003 conference.
